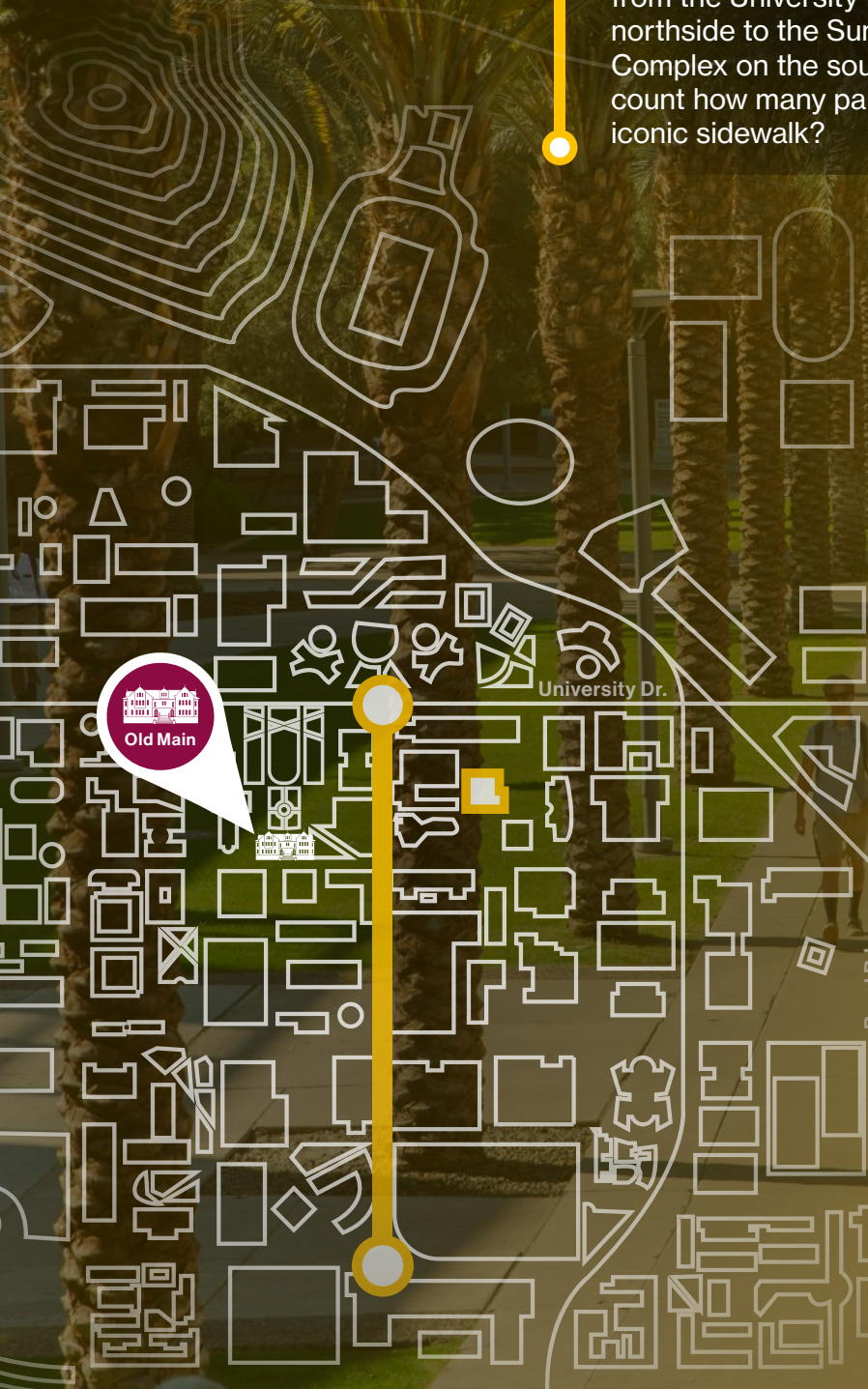
Palm walk

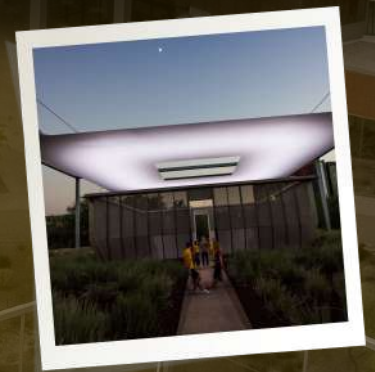
ASU Art Museum
